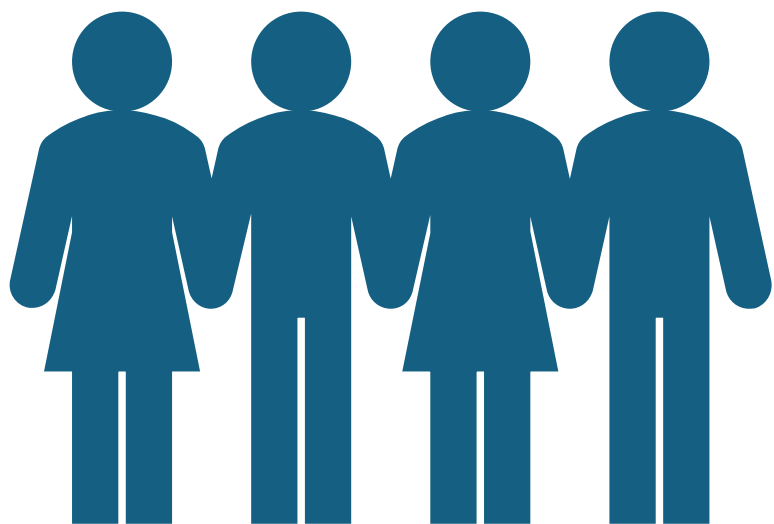

Our Deacons



Deacon Deborah Hamilton

Rev. Deborah Hamilton was born, raised, and lived in Baltimore County, Maryland. She dedicated her love and life to Jesus at 12 years old. She did missionary work in a deaf orphanage in Ensenada, Mexico for 3 months in 1970, was a member of one of the first young contemporary Christian bands in the late 60s and 70s which traveled across the US, appeared on a local weekly TV program, appeared on the 700 Club in its early beginnings, is a recorded Christian songwriter, singer, musician and, when needed, a worship leader. She is a Certified Behavioral Analyst. In 1973, she and Rev. Ron Hamilton were married and have been in ministry, pastoring together for more than 50 years. She and her husband planted a church in Maryland in 1988, pastoring there for 15 years. They moved to South Carolina in 2010. In 2012, she was received into the Anglican Communion at The Well By The Sea, Myrtle Beach. In 2018, she was ordained into the Vocational Diaconate by Bishop Mark Lawrence. Along with leading worship, she moderates a weekly Bereavement Group, teaches the Bible Discussion Group, provides Christian Counseling for all ages, publishes the weekly church newsletter, creates periodic Educational Outreach Classes for the community, teaches a segment in the Spiritual Gifts Workshop, and assists the Rector in various ways at his request. She enjoys everything ministry; music; editing books, articles and papers; administering the "Personality Assessment;" writing; driving a 5-speed stick; and online word games that help her go to sleep at night.

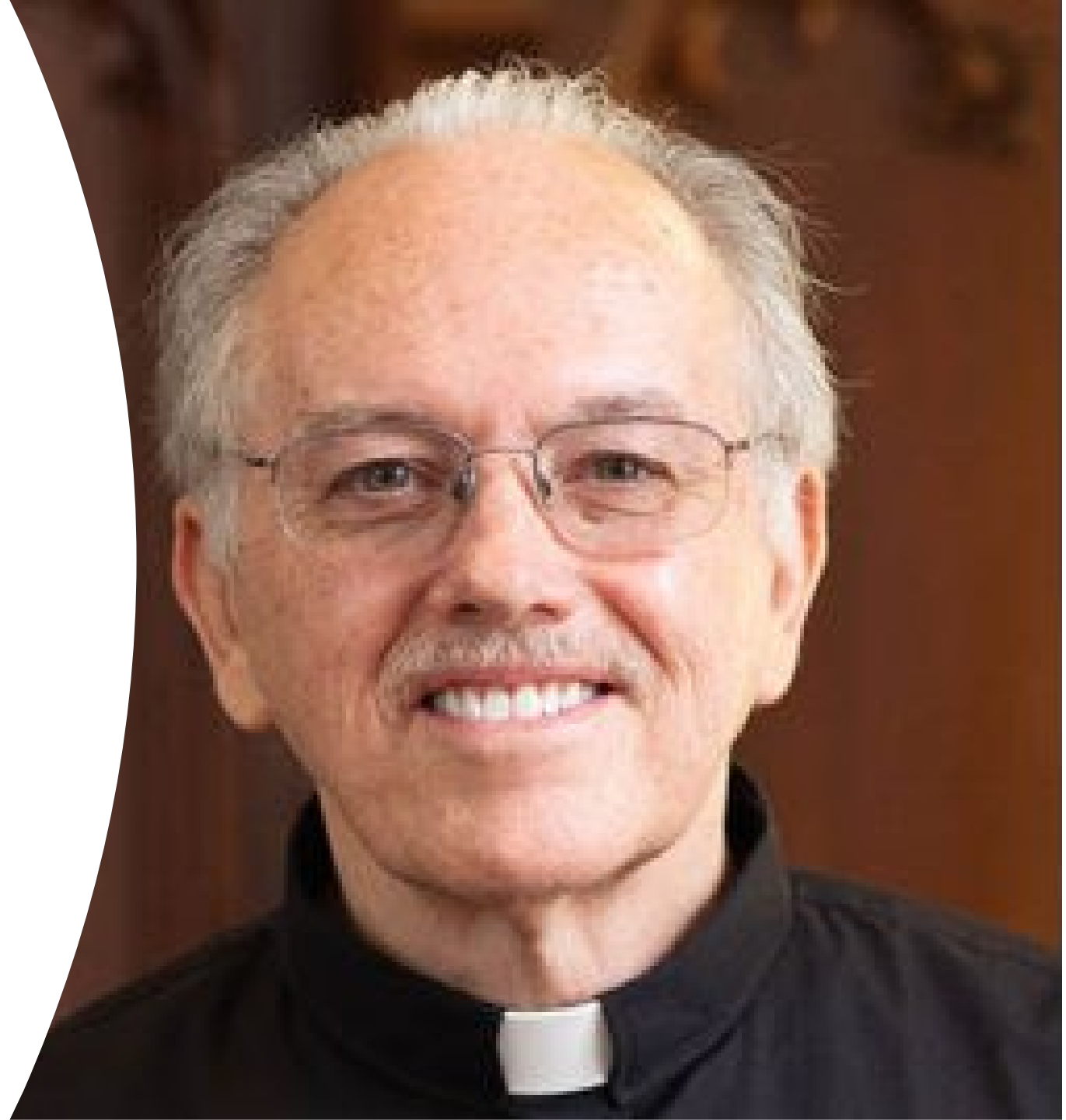
Deacon Ron Hamilton

Rev. Ron Hamilton and his wife, Rev. Deborah Hamilton, began attending the Well in 2011 after meeting Fr Tom during the early planting of the Well.

Ron was ordained in 1973 and began his first pastorate in 1974. In Maryland, he and his wife co-planted a church in 1978 and, in 1988, planted a new church where he was senior pastor for 15 years (both of those churches in different denominations).

After moving to South Carolina, Ron and Deborah were drawn to the Well church plant and have participated in its ministries over the last 12 years. At the encouragement of Fr. Tom Woodle and the approval of Bishop Mark Lawrence, both Ron and Deborah pursued the vocational diaconate in the Anglican Communion, were ordained in 2018, and now serve the body of believers at the Well and some outreaches into the community.

Currently at The Well, Ron is overseer or coordinator of the following ministries: Audio/Visual Ministry, Evangelism Ministry, Hangout Bible Study Ministry, Lay Eucharistic Ministry, Pastoral Care Ministry, and Technical Coordinator.





Deacon Glenn Ohanesian

Glenn and his wife Karolan helped plant The Well in 2009 and have watched God's hand on The Well from the beginning to the current day. They and their two sons, Zack and Sam, have worked in various ministries over the past 15 years. Glenn was ordained as a vocational deacon a little over five years ago after discovering the spiritual gift of prayer and healing. He has helped lead prayer and healing ministry at The Well both before and after ordination. He assists as he is able with Sunday services and participates in the Ukes by the Sea music ministry. Glenn continues to work full time in the legal field in addition to his ministry at The Well.

- To provide programming that leads individuals and families into spiritual maturity and abundant life.



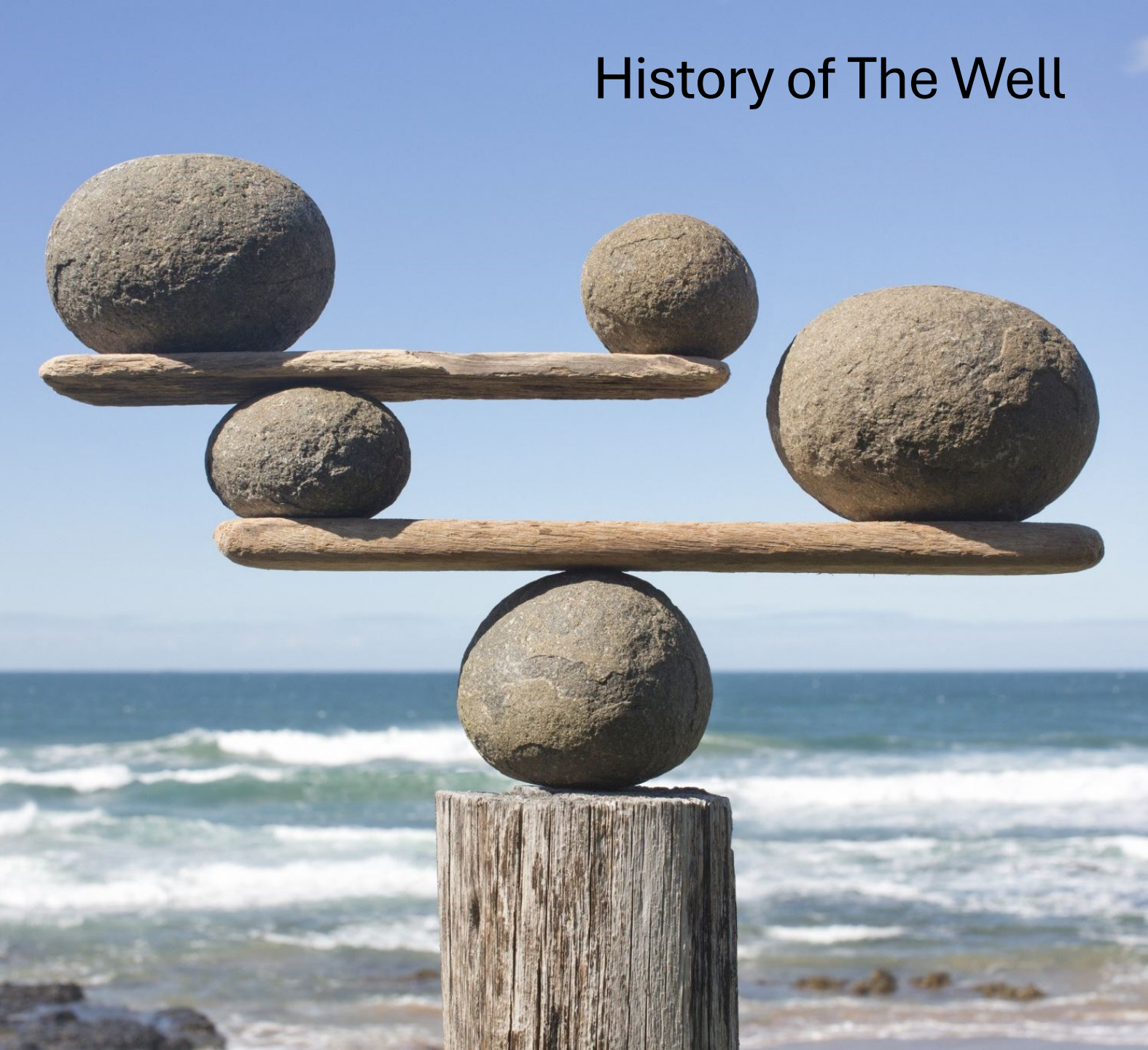
Strategic Plan

History of The Well



In October 2008, Fr. Tom Woodle met with Bishop Mark Lawrence who suggested a church plant, which would be the first in 40 years in the Diocese of South Carolina.

With a team of (6) pairs of husbands and wives, “A Contemporary Church in the Anglican Tradition” was planted.

Shortly afterwards, we were blessed with spaces at the Market Common, a local shopping village, and began holding services on Sunday evenings. We started with people bringing their own bag chairs. We met at the Market Common for about two years.

Subsequently, we moved to a local Elementary School and, upon leaving there, rented an office building, transforming the inside into a very nicely workable church setting.





Blessings Galore

Since day-one, God has been guiding us and providing at every step as we continued moving forward.

In 2012, a nearby church contacted us and asked if we wanted to purchase their building, with an offer that can only be described as God ordained.

In January 2024, we celebrated our church's 15th anniversary with the Lord having so generously blessed us by making it possible to pay off our mortgage. We now completely own our building and grounds.

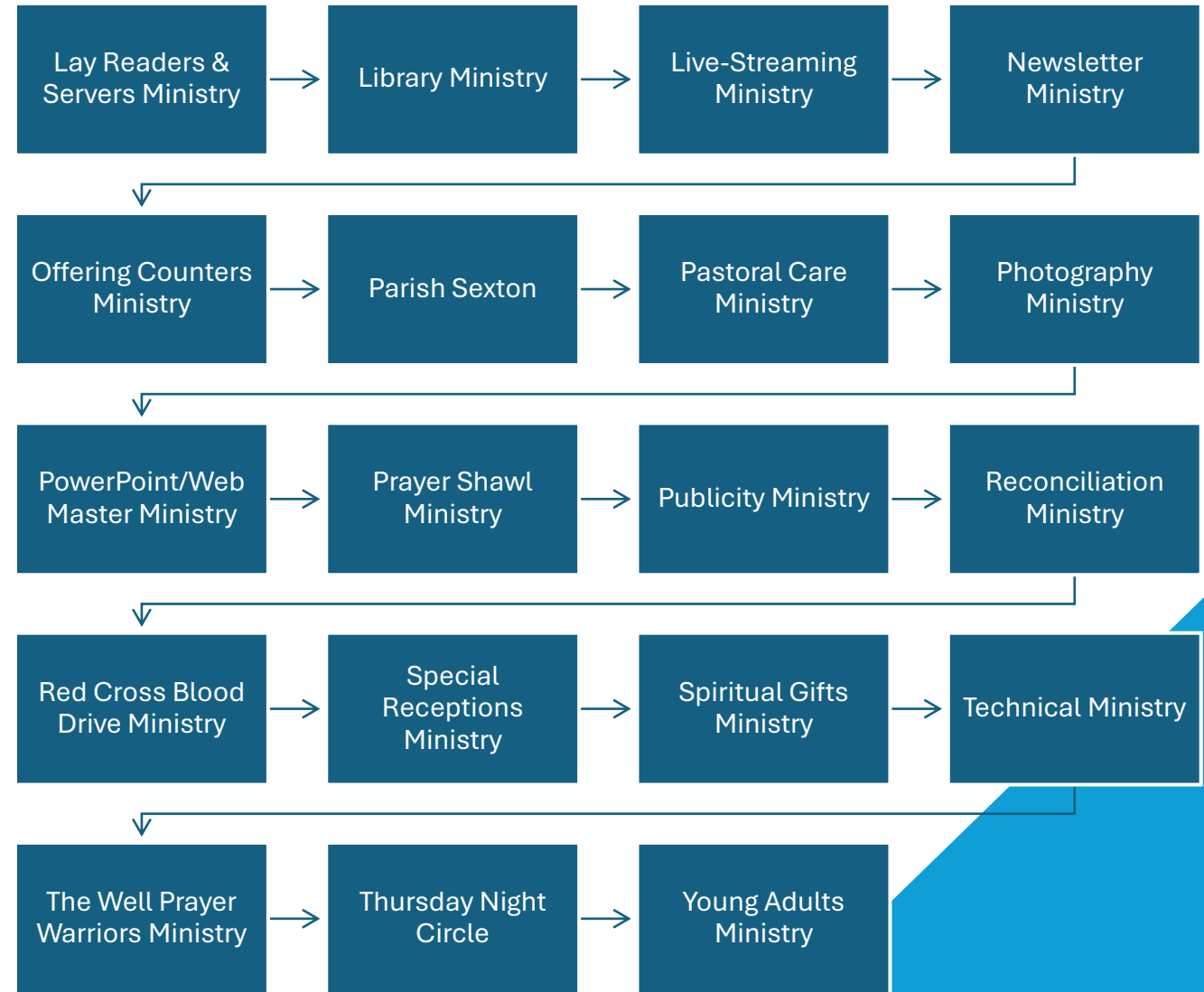

Missions

We're All God's Children seeks to alleviate the distress of poverty by: Providing medical care, education and resources to those in under-served areas of the world. Including building schools; providing deep, clean water wells, solar pumps and water towers; teaching usable life skills and providing needed items to senior centers, homeless shelters and children's activity centers.



The Well partners with Lespwa Timoun Clinic (which means “Hope for Children”) to deliver health, nutrition and educational services to those in need in eight communities in and around Port-au-Prince, Haiti.



Help 4 Kids serves around 3,000 children weekly, providing food, clothing, and school supplies. Congregation members donate monthly food items, help supply Back-to-School needs and participate in the Annual Christmas Drive.



Worship Music & Liturgy



Since The Well was founded as a “Contemporary Church in the Anglican Tradition,” we follow the Anglican Liturgy, but have never used an Anglican hymnbook.

We use contemporary praise and worship songs and incorporate them into the songs’ portions of our weekly and special services.

We also sing some familiar hymns which have been slightly modernized.

Our church has been characterized as Joyful.

8. We're Intelligent!

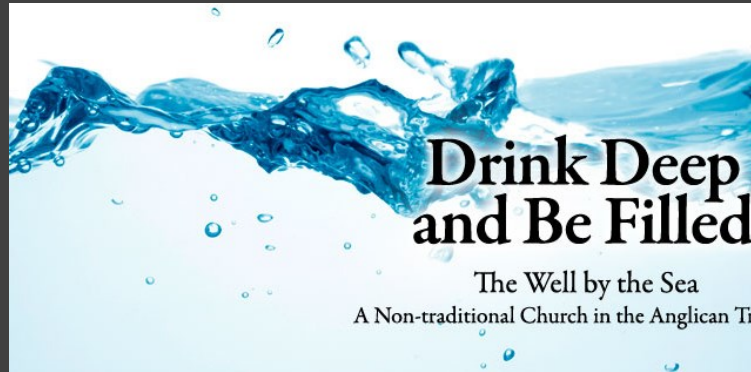
